# Safety above all else

**S**afety" is a universal word that is mentioned often. Companies across all industries are generally committed to safety, although there are times it would be easy to ignore safety in the interest of convenience or expediency. However, safety is a serious issue, especially when it comes to electrical safety.

At Amicalola EMC, safety is our No. 1 priority. Over time, we've created a culture of safety by putting our employees' safety and that of the community above all else. Each day, we strive to deliver affordable and reliable electricity to our memberowners, but equally important, we want our employees to return home safely to their loved ones. To do this requires ongoing focus, dedication and vigilance.

# Following leading national safety standards

Working with electricity is an inherently dangerous job, especially for lineworkers. Georgia EMC (GEMC), our statewide trade association, has a safety team whose primary focus is keeping our employees and the community safe around electricity. Working with GEMC, our safety team establishes and follows safety protocols based on leading national safety practices for the utility industry. We require our lineworkers to wear specialized equipment when



working next to or with power lines. There are specific protocols that our lineworkers follow when dealing with electricity. Our safety team has regular meetings where they discuss upcoming projects from a safety perspective. They monitor and track issues in order to understand them, share "lessons learned" and to improve in the future. Data is examined to discern patterns, and safety metrics are used to improve in those areas where we have fallen short.

Just as important, we encourage all of our crews to speak up and hold each other accountable for safety. By cultivating a culture of openness and transparency, we promote problemsolving in regard to safety. In addition, we brief contractors on our safety protocols and set expectations for their engagement.

### Keeping the community safe

We live and work in the community we serve, and we care about our neighbors. Periodically, we conduct electrical safety demonstrations in schools and for community events. Todd Payne President/CEO Amicalola EMC




Amicalola EMC is pleased to announce Marley Hamby, of Dawson County High School, as a 2018 statewide Walter

# **Process for electing directors**

Members of Amicalola Electric Membership Corporation are reminded that nominations for the Amicalola EMC (AEMC) Board of Directors will be posted July 8, 2018. The Nominating Committee's recommendations for the board will be posted on the bulletin board at the main office in Jasper, Ga., and on the AEMC website.

The Amicalola EMC Bylaws state "that the committee on nominations shall make at least one nomination for each post for director to be voted on at the annual meeting. The committee shall prepare and post at the principal office of the Cooperative at least ninety (90) days (July 8, 2018) before the meeting, a list of nominations for directors, but any fifteen (15) or more members may make other nominations in writing over their signatures no less than sixty (60) days (August 7, 2018) prior to the meeting, and the Secretary shall post the same at the same place where the list of nominations made by the committee is posted."

# Unclaimed capital credits

A list of unclaimed capital credit refunds is available for review. You may access it on our website *amicalolaemc.com* or in person at any local Amicalola EMC office. The last day to claim these funds is Aug. 31, 2018. At that time, unclaimed funds will be distributed for charitable purposes in accordance with Georgia unclaimed property laws.
